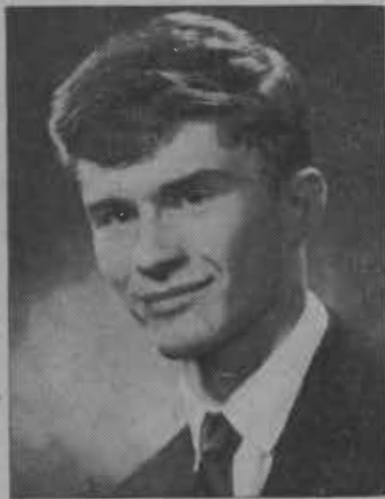

Here we will present to you a brief introduction of our candidates and their qualifications.

★ Jim Alexis, **PROGRESSIVE'S** presidential candidate, has demonstrated his executive ability in his successful term as freshman and sophomore class president, and a junior class executive board member. Included in his accomplishments during these three years was his general chairmanship of the sophomore dance, *Whispering Winds*. He has also gained much experience in Student Council procedure through his work as social chairman, representative to the Indiana Student Council Convention, and junior member of the Student Council executive board. Jim's classmates have also selected him as coronation co-chairman for the Junior Prom and have honored him by election to the Junior Prom Court.

★ For the post of vice-president, we have nominated John Shimer. He has participated in many of Central's varied activities, ranging from lead roles in "Gypsy Baron" and "The Magic Flute" to membership on the American Field Service executive board. John,

also, has acquired much administrative know-how in his capacities as president of the sub-district and executive officer of district and northern Indiana Methodist youth groups, as member of the freshman, sophomore, and junior class executive boards, and as delegate to the Indiana Student Council Convention. John's diversified abilities have been further displayed in his weekly column in the **INTERLUDE** newspaper, his participation as a soloist in the Glee Club, and his consistent membership on the Honor Roll.

★ Sue Graveel, our secretarial nominee, is a personality well known around Central. Her popularity has gained her a position on both the Football Queen's Court and the Junior Prom Court. Her ambition and responsibility have been exemplified by her chairmanships on the A. F. S. Drive, the '59 Eagle-Bear Romp, the Junior Prom, various Student Council activities, sophomore dance and Teen-O-Scope. Her interest and activity on the **INTERLUDE** newspaper have been rewarded by her nomination to the post of Exchange Editor, while her academic ability has frequently earned her a position on the Honor Roll. In addition to Sue's other Student Council activities, she gained much valuable experience as a representative to the Indiana Student Council Convention.

Student Council treasurer, has, along with the other three **PROGRESSIVE** candidates, been a delegate to the Indiana Student Council Convention.
