



BEARS VIE FOR SECTIONAL CROWN!

As this goes to press, Central's basketball team has compiled an impressive 12-9 record including seven straight wins. This team relatively young with only two members who saw varsity action last year, three sophomores, and somewhat short with only four members over six feet, has proven to its followers to be ready, willing and able to take-on any opponent they meet in sectional play. This article will give the reader a view of the team and their individual attitudes.

Kenny Bethel, a senior and captain of the team, is a starting guard who wears number 34 and stands 5'11". Kenny is the only returning guard from last year's squad and is known for his quick movements, facial expressions, and visiting fans in the bleachers as he looks for stray balls. He shoots well from any place on the court as has been demonstrated several times as he fired the last-second winning basket to chalk up another victory for our squad. Kenny also enjoys a good game of billiards, likes to sing and participate in other school activities. He is anticipating furthering his education in business relations at In-

diana State University before possibly going on to professional basketball. When asked to give his views of the team as its captain Ken replied, "The team is coming along fine since we're all learning and experiencing teamwork. With the team's efforts, the backing of the student body, and Mr. Powers' fine coaching, we should be able to go far."

Eugene Chism, also returning from last year's squad, is a fine shooter and rebounder and at 6'5" is the tallest center which could be an important factor in a crucial game. Number 55 was absent from the line-up during the first-half of the season due to a knee injury for which Gene still wears a brace, and because of a throat infection. But, the famous "Chism-dunk-shot" seems to be making up for the time lost as Gene continually boosts his shooting average to nearly 10 points per game. Aside from pulling basketballs off the backboard, Gene participates in other school activities where he was recently seen restoring wall murals with other students from the art department. Gene is undecided on which institution he will further his educa-

tion, but does hope to pursue professional basketball and coaching.

Jake Claybrook is the Bruins' second tallest player standing at 6'4", is a junior and holds a forwarding position. Jake is also known for his fine rebounding and fast moving abilities. Jake boasts a 10-point average and takes the game of basketball seriously and combines with his teammates to be a constant threat to the opposition.

Tommy "Yippah" Davis, the Bruins' top scorer, is a 5'9" sophomore who wears number 44. Holding the forward and sometimes guard position, Yip is a stand-out with his 13-point average. His quick movements and ability to shoot from 15 to 20 feet has proved to be an asset for the Powersmen. This being Tom's first year in varsity action, it is also his first year to experience sectional play. Like all beginners, he is excited with the usual amount of flutters.

Charles Fuller, another fine sophomore, stands 5'9" and plays forward. His jumping ability helps our big boys carry the load of rebounding. Charley is excellent at the free-throw line and also at his position. This is his first year on varsity and his reply to going into the sectionals was, "I'm ready, but as usual, I'm a little nervous too. It's been a thrill working with the fellas on varsity, and I intend to contribute my best throughout sectional play."

Playing his first year on varsity in the forwarding position wearing number 45 is senior, **Keane Harvey**. Keane can be seen shooting long jump-shots from the cor-

ner that have a habit of going in the basket. He is also a great defensive rebounder and ballhawk. Keane plans to continue his education at one of Indiana's leading universities, and also continue playing ball. Keane's reply as to his going into the sectionals was, "We, the team and the student body, are ready! As long as all the kids are backing us and care what happens, we as players will give our all."

Jimmy King is the newest member of the team wearing number 43 and holding down one of the guard positions. Jimmy stands a mighty 5'11" and supports the quote, "better late, than never." Jim has been one of Mr. Powers' surprises for the opposition. He is a good ball player with speed and has an excellent shooting eye. Since action hasn't seen much of Jimmy, he plans to help the Bears see much of it.

The swiftest of the three sophomores is oftentimes said to be **Carlton "Mellowrob" Robertson**. This guard stands a mere 5'9", but fans often see number 35 high off the floor. Other times have seen Carlton dribbling past the opposition's big boys to move on in for a lay-up. Carlton is one of the players who notices and appreciates student backing. Going into his first sectional play, Carlton comments, "I too, enjoy working with all my teammates. Especially with the seniors, I feel privileged. I feel with all of the team members' abilities, Mr. Powers' coaching, and 100%-99½% won't do—of the student body behind us, there'll be an all-out effort to keep

the sectional crown here, at Central."

Don "Puffs" Stratigos, 5'10" senior guard, can still hear a ringing in his ear from the cheers as he hooped the 101st point in the Jackson game. This is Don's first year on the varsity. Don has shot well at the free-throw line and also from side-court. He played varsity football for two years and was one of last year's high-scoring B-team players. Don is also active in other school activities, likes to sing "for the fun of it," and plans to go on to college.

Larry Szczechowski, another senior, stands 6'2" and is a forward. He is good at rebounding and passing. Larry started practice late this season due to being selected as an All-State football player. Larry saw action last year as a B-team starter.

Due to knee injuries, senior **Ron Banks** has seen very little action this season, but will be on hand to assist in the keeping of record and statistics throughout the tournament. Junior, Paul Smith and sophomore, Cleophus Kilgore, will serve as team substitutes.

A vital part of any basketball team is the coaching staff. **Mr. Jim Powers**, head coach, and **Mr. Bruce Smith**, B-team coach, head the staff. Mr. Powers has been the head coach for the past eight years and has had many teams and victories to be proud of. During these eight years he has coached six teams to sectional crown winnings. Mr. Smith's B-team did well this season with a record of 10-10.

Central Leads Sectionals

When all of the schools in the sectional cheer for Central's opponents, do not be alarmed. There is a simple reason for their actions. Central in the past forty years of the South Bend Sectional has been champion 24 times. Add to this the six times it has been runners-up and one sees a clear domination of the tourney on Central's part. So complete is this domination, that the Bears have won three times as many crowns as the next team, Mishawaka. The Maroons have picked up seven championships, their last victory in 1955 when they had 6' 6" Leroy Johnson. Close on the Maroons' heels are the Riley Wildcats, who have mobbed six crowns over the years. Their best years came during the thirties when they gained half of their championships. Riley has been waiting since 1952 to obtain a new sectional trophy for its school.

Only two other schools have more than one title to their name. Washington won their first as a new school in 1938 and then waited to 1965 to win a hotly contested game over Central. Adams also has two champion teams, the latest coming in 1958. The River Park school's first crown came 14 years earlier.

Though called the South Bend Sectional, several non-area teams have seen action in tournament. In fact, one year the St. Joseph county teams were not even represented when Nappanee defeated Goshen for the crown.

Besides dominating the winning statistics, the Bears hold many other records. Central's defense looked in top form when defeating North Liberty 33 to 5 to give the Shamrocks the all-time low scoring record in 1930. Bears' offense has been no pansy either. Last year they grabbed the scoring crown for final games by racking up 97 points against Washington. One year in a championship game they won by the unlikely low score of 24-12. Quite an all around team—the Central Bears!
